The Partnership for Community Health will be organizing health improvement work around a regional Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP).

A Regional Community Health Improvement Plan is:

- A plan with priorities, goals, strategies, and measures that guide Linn, Benton, and Lincoln county health improvement efforts.
- Actions to improve the health of our whole community, with special attention to issues of health equity.
- Developed with qualitative and quantitative data, community values and voices.
- A living document that gets renewed on a three-year cycle.
