Access to Affordable Housing/Homelessness

Access to safe, quality, and affordable housing is critical for healthy living.

Key Health Data

- Across the Linn, Benton, and Lincoln region, 31% of unhoused persons had a disabling condition.
- Of these unhoused persons in the region, 41% experienced homelessness for a year or more which is defined as chronic homelessness.
- Over 50% of homes in our region were built before 1980.

Focus on: Youth Housing

The percent of K-12 students experiencing homelessness in Lincoln County was 3 times higher than the state in 2019-2020.

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Focus on: Cost of Living




Half of rented households in our region were experiencing a housing burden in 2020.
