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HEALTH ADVISORY: Long Term Care Facility Respiratory Outbreak Guidance

Dear Colleagues,

We hope this message finds you well.

Benton County Health Department is sharing long term care facility (LTCF) respiratory outbreak guidance. The respiratory guidance is related to outbreak prevention, reporting, and mitigation. To better communicate respiratory outbreak guidance to our LTCF colleagues, this health advisory includes:

1. OHA's March 2024 Respiratory Disease Outbreak Guidelines

A summary of key points from OHA's March 2024 Respiratory Guidelines is available below:

<u>Outbreak Definitions & Reporting (Section 3, Page 3):</u> Respiratory outbreaks are to be reported if there are **two or more individuals** epidemiologically linked (**epi-linked**; that is, 2 or more people who share a disease exposure) during a **7-day period** with any of the following:

- 2 or more lab-confirmed individuals (e.g., residents, staff, visitors).
- 1 lab-confirmed individual and 1 or more individuals with similar symptoms.
- 2 or more individuals without a lab-confirmed disease but have similar symptoms with a known epi-link.

<u>Recommendations for LTCFs (Section 5.2.2, Page 6)</u>: LTCFs are deemed to be a "high-consequence" setting due to residents being at increased risk for severe disease or mortality. Recommendations include:

Strongly encourage vaccination for staff and residents as preventative measure.

- Strongly encourage prompt clinical evaluation and testing of individuals with symptoms.
- Strongly encourage prompt prophylaxis and treatment during an outbreak.
- Conduct contact tracing and targeted testing during outbreaks.
- Utilize appropriate PPE during outbreaks.

Note: Respiratory outbreaks are resolved **14 days** after the last individual's onset date.

Return to Work Guidance (Section 5.2.2, Page 6): Generally, sick staff can return to work after:

- <u>COVID-19</u>: 24 hours since last fever without medicine AND 7 days since onset for COVID-19 if negative viral test obtained between days 5-7 (otherwise, 10 days)
- FLU: 24 hours since last fever without medicine AND 7 days since symptom onset
- RSV: 24 hours since last fever without medicine AND recovery from symptoms

<u>Periods of Communicability (Section 2.4, Page 2):</u> OHA shared a <u>Compendium of Respiratory</u> <u>Diseases</u>. The compendium includes common respiratory diseases with incubation periods, symptoms, transmission, etc.

<u>Severe Outbreaks (Section 5, Pages 4-5)</u>: Severe respiratory outbreak morbidity or mortality is defined as:

- 2 more or more deaths or 3 or more hospitalizations within 2 weeks
- Confirmed pneumonia in 3 or more epi-linked individuals with unknown etiology
- Clusters of new or uncommon signs or symptoms
